

The Lord Mayor of the City of London River Progress 2024

The Lord Mayor of London has charged his Water Bailiff and Under Bailiff to travel by boat on the River Thames from the City of London to the London Stone in Staines upon Thames on the 28th & 29th June visiting and saluting the Royal National Lifeboat Institute stations on route.

On the 30th June the Lord Mayor, Rt Hon. Alderman Professor Michael Mainelli, will join them aboard their craft and escorted by a flotilla of powered and unpowered craft, cruise to the London Stone where at 11.30am he will meet the Mayor of Spelthorne and other dignitaries and mark the occasion with due ceremony.



The last visit by a Lord Mayor to the London Stone was in 1973. The stone marks the point up to where for over 400 years the City of London used to control the River Thames.
