


November 2023 to November 2024



The Knowledge Miles Lecture Series, part of the 695th Lord Mayor's term in 2023-2024, was a year-long initiative championed by Alderman Professor Michael Mainelli. The series of 103 lectures, hosted by the Gresham Society, aligned with Michael's mayoral theme "Connect to Prosper – The Knowledge Miles in the World's Coffeehouse", emphasising London's role as a global hub for innovation, knowledge exchange, and economic collaboration.






Objectives

Celebration of Knowledge Ecosystems: The series highlighted the concentration of over 40 learned societies, 70 universities, and 130 research institutes within London's financial district, promoting the intersection of technology, science, and finance.



The Livery Companies of the City of London and their members have been supporting prisons and offenders for over 600 years. In the 1420s, Richard Whittington funded the rebuilding of Newgate Prison. More recently, many Livery Companies have supported the Sheriff & Recorders Fund annually since 1805 at the Old Bailey. Today, they champion prison charities focused on reducing reoffending and enhancing mental well-being. The 2021 Pan Livery Survey on philanthropic giving highlighted that Livery Companies contributed £1.6 million towards reducing reoffending in that year alone






Highlights
